Our community education, outreach & prevention team grounds their work in cultural humility. They partner with other immigrant-serving agencies, faith groups, community leaders, cultural organizations, corporate groups, and schools to create programming around the sensitive topics of domestic and sexual violence. They also conduct trainings for professionals who regularly interact with Asian and immigrant survivors: police officers, victim service advocates, shelter staff, healthcare providers, and court employees.
